

Pot up your tomato plug plants into a 7 or 9cm pot, using a well drained good quality compost. Add 20% of drainage material like sharp sand, perlite, etc and mix up.

Once you have planted your plant plugs water once and do not water again until the compost has dried out.

We have done some tests for pot sizes with these tomato plants, and can recommend that you start with a small pot, like a 9cm, and then pot up into a 2 litre pot after a few weeks. Before moving up a pot size, make sure your plant has fully outgrown its 9cm pot. If the roots fill the pot, it's time to move to a bigger pot.



The photograph above, shows 2 plants. One of each plug plant was potted up into 2x 9cm pots. After a few weeks the plant on the right was potted up into a 2 litre pot. The one on the left remained in the 9cm pot. A 2 litre pot is about as big as it gets for a windowsill. If you wanted to grow these on a patio where you have more room, then it would do no harm to pot the plant up again into a 5 litre pot.

Once the plant starts to bear some green fruit, feed at least once a week with a well known tomato liquid feed available from almost anywhere that sells garden stuff ! Or feed at half strength every time you water.

If growing on a windowsill, turn the pot round once a week. Saucers placed under then pot during hot weather will help to retain some water.
